The event is a collaborative effort with representatives from the Center for Reconciliation of the Episcopal Diocese of Rhode Island, Temple Beth-El, Rhode Island for Community and Justice, The Muslim Americans Dawah Center of Rhode Island, Calvary Baptist Church, The Institute for the Study and Practice of Nonviolence, Grace Episcopal Church, the Rhode Island Philharmonic Music School and the Rhode Island State Council of Churches.

The Center for Reconciliation is a non-profit organization founded by the Episcopal Diocese of Rhode Island to offer and support efforts leading to racial justice, healing, and

reconciliation. The center offers a variety of unique programs, events and experiences that create spaces for learning about and discussing America's history of slavery, the slave trade and its legacies. They collaborate with partner organizations, churches, and community groups across the state; seeking to be catalysts, collaborators and conveners within the church and community. They are renovating the Cathedral of St. John on North Main Street in Providence as the center's future home and a safe space where people can engage in dialogue about the challenging issues of race and differences.
