

## **Spotlight on Grace:** A Lenten Message from the Rector



Just as the Sabbath is an opportunity to take time away from our daily routine and turn our attention to God and our spiritual lives and communities, so too Lent is a season to remind ourselves of who we are and whose we are.

Many of us have known since childhood of the Christian practice of giving something up during Lent, or the modern version of taking on a practice during Lent. Both of those can be spiritually wo rthwhile

endeavors. One has to be careful, though, not to short-change the experience by "gaming the system." My mother tells of her Lenten practices in her teenage years, when she would give up candy and ice cream and replace them with marshmallows and sherbet!

One practice you can take on is to join with other Anglicans, as we did here at Grace last year, in following the Lenten Series of the brothers of the Society of St. John the Evangelist. This year's program is called "5 Marks of Love", and can be found here. Following this program during Lent is taking on a Lenten practice that combines the ancient (monastic spirituality) and the modern (internet videos). Beginning Ash Wednesday, we will open each weekday from 8:30-9:00am for Morning Monastic Meditation (please see below). I hope you all will be moved to undertake a Lenten practice of some kind - either those we're lifting up at Grace or elsewhere. Doing so is one of



the best ways to fully experience the joy of the Easter that is to come.
