Spotlight on Grace: The Pavilion Whirls Toward Completion

The construction of The Pavilion at Grace is whirling forward, with scheduled completion remaining on track for this Summer.

Just this morning, this giant circular saw blade pictured at right was busy slicing through stout walls of brick before the crew can insert doors at each level of the new staitower. At the same time, the opening for the connector doorway that will provide access to the new building directly from the Nave of Grace Church has been thoroughly prepped with all of the exterior stone removed and only the interior wood paneling remaining in place until that door is ready for installation.



With the metal wall framing all in place on the interior, the electricians have begun to install the wiring for the new building, which will be followed by another flurry of wires for doors fobs and security, internet, telephone, etc. All the while, windows will be set into their new frames in rapid succession, and then the installation of drywall will rapidly begin to give a more finished feel to the interior. Offsite, a skilled craftsman is fabricating the fence and gates for the perimeter along Westminster Street, and stones are being selected for the hand-laid labyrinth that will become a focal feature of the exterior space.

Your Health & Wellness Minute

May is Skin Cancer Prevention Month

"Heal me, O Lord, and I shall be healed; save me, and I shall be saved, for you are my praise." Jeremiah 17:14

Since its inception in 1979, [The Skin Cancer Foundation](#) has always recommended using a sunscreen with an SPF 15 or higher as one important part of a complete sun protection regimen. Sunscreen alone is not enough, however.



Here are some additional tips: Seek the shade, especially between 10 AM and 4 PM. Do not burn. Avoid tanning and UV tanning beds. Cover up with clothing, including a broad-brimmed hat and UV-blocking sunglasses. Use a broad spectrum (UVA/UVB) sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher every day. For extended outdoor activity, use a water-resistant, broad spectrum (UVA/UVB) sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher. Apply 1 ounce (2 tablespoons) of sunscreen to your entire body 30 minutes before going outside. Re-apply every two hours or immediately after swimming or excessive sweating. Keep newborns out of the sun. Sunscreens should be used on babies over the age of six months. Examine your skin head-to-toe every month. See your physician every year for a professional skin exam.
