

# Spotlight on Grace: The Holy Trinity in Grace's Glass

As we gather to reflect upon the glory and wonder of the Holy Trinity this Sunday, by far the oldest stained glass window here at Grace -- and indeed one of the oldest stained glass windows in the country -- focuses our gaze upon this beautiful symbol of the Holy Trinity (pictured at right).

First installed in 1846 as two of the three windows in the original Grace Church chancel as designed by Richard Upjohn (see photo below and right), these windows were later combined and moved to their current location in 1882 when a new chancel window was dedicated. The present-day location of this 1846 stained glass is along the East wall of the Nave, the third window from the chapel. In our brochure about Grace's stained glass, available at our welcome table, you'll find it identified as *Window* #5.




The Trinity symbol featured therein incorporates two common symbols of the Trinity -- both the triangle and the three circular arcs interlaced together -- and they are surrounded by a circle to emphasize the unity of the whole combination of the three forces.

Symbols abound in this 1846 window. Below the Trinity are the Greek letters Chi and Rho,

the first two letters of *Kbristos*, or Christ. And above the Trinity are two more Greek letters -- Alpha and Omega -- representing the eternity of God.

Directly to the left of the Trinity symbol is the cross surrounded by the letters INRI, the abbreviation in Latin for the title that Pontius Pilate ordered written on the cross: "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews". Above the cross is the Hebrew word for God, or *Yahweh*, and below the cross you will no doubt recognize the anchor on a white shield that is both the symbol of hope and the seal of the state of Rhode Island.




# This Week at Grace
