



Spotlight on Grace: Marking a 500 Year Anniversary

This year marks the 500th anniversary of the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. It was in October of 1517 that Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses (statements of belief related to theology and church practice) to the doors of All Saints' Church in Wittenberg, Germany.



Join us this fall for an ecumenical commemoration of the Reformation, hosted by three churches in the City of Providence: Calvary Baptist, Central Congregational, and Grace Episcopal. A series of 4 lectures in October (the month that Martin Luther is said to have started the Reformation by posting his 95 Theses), each session will begin with a reception and conclude with a period of Q&A with the speakers, who join us from churches and colleges throughout Providence. The series concludes on All Saints' Sunday (November 5th) with a Reformation Evensong service at 5 p.m., featuring music of the 16th century. All lectures take place on Wednesdays at 6 p.m.

October 4: "Christianity in Western Europe on the Eve of the Reformation." Speaker: Prof. Matthew Snider, University of Massachusetts at Dartmouth. Location: Grace Church, 300 Westminster Street.

October 11: "Martin Luther and the Dawn of Protestantism." Speaker: Prof. Tara Nummedal, Brown University. Location: Central Congregational Church, 296 Angell Street.

October 18: "The Emergence of Protestantism in England." Speaker: Prof. Jeannine Olson,

Rhode Island College. Location: Grace Church, 300 Westminster Street.

October 25: "The Protestant Experience in early Rhode Island." Speakers: Stanley Lemons, Historian of the First Baptist Church in America; Ray Rickman, Executive Director of Stages of Freedom; Prof. Adrian Weimer, Providence College. Location: Calvary Baptist Church, 747 Broad Street.

Sunday, November 5th at 5 p.m.: Reformation Evensong service featuring the combined choirs of Grace Church in Providence and St. Luke's Church, East Greenwich. Location: Grace Church, 300 Westminster Street.


participate in the inaugural Doors Open RI Festival, Saturday, September 23, 10:00am-5:00pm. Free and open to the public.

Additional free parking is also available on the top level only of the PPAC parking garage, for which the entrance is on Weybosset Street. A stairway from the top level leads right to Chapel Street across from the church. A small number of spaces are available on the portion of the Grace Church lot facing Snow Street, along an inset section of the construction fence. 
Support Hurricane Relief Efforts


