Spotlight on Grace: The New Paschal Candlestick at Grace

You may have noticed at the Easter Vigil, or on Easter Day that Grace Church has a beautiful new Paschal Candlestick (and candle!) The Candlestick was given in loving memory of Lester and Virginia (Les and Ginny) Fales, longtime parishioners of Grace Church.

Les was on the vestry and served as treasurer, and Ginny participated in various women's groups at Grace. Les and Ginny's son Steve is a retired Episcopal priest, having served parishes in Rhode Island, Connecticut and Indiana. Steve, his wife Marian and their daughters Becca Silvestri and Bethany Jackson are so pleased to make this memorial gift in memory of their beloved parents and grandparents.

The beautiful solid brass candlestick was chosen by Altar Guild co-directors Lois Lewis and Phylis Noke, along with former



director Sandra Read. The Paschal Candlestick will stay in its place near the pulpit for the Great Fifty Days of Easter (through Pentecost Sunday) and then will reside in the Chapel of the Messiah, where a plaque will detail its dedication.

The archbishop graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in theology from Cuttington University College in Liberia and received his Master of Divinity degree from the Episcopal Divinity School in Cambridge, Massachusetts. 
Thursday Concerts at Noon: April 26 will feature Vince Edwards, Organ.

Parking for Worship: Free parking for Sunday worship is provided:

1.) in the lot diagonally across Westminster Street, on the NW corner of Westminster and Snow;

2.) On the **top level only** of the PPAC parking garage, for which the entrance is on Weybosset Street. A stairway from the top level leads right to Chapel Street across from the church; and

3.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.

Education for Ministry


