



## Spotlight on Grace: Seeing Jesus in the Refugee

As I mentioned in my sermon this past Sunday, this Wednesday was World Refugee Day. That that day should arrive at a time when our nation is especially focused on the plight of refugees and asylum seekers, as we have seen families torn apart at our southern border, is either coincidence or providence. The situation on the ground near the border changes day by day, but we are always called to care for those in trouble and those seeking refuge in our land. Our own presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church, The Rt. Rev. Michael Curry, spoke on the occasion of World Refugee Day of our vocation as followers of Jesus, and [I encourage you to watch the video here](#). Jesus himself spoke repeatedly of caring for those in need, but care for the alien is rooted in the Hebrew scriptures (the Old Testament), long before that: "When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien. The alien who



resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God." (Leviticus 19:33-34) May we have the desire and strength to care for those in need, and may our elected leaders be compassionate and merciful to all those coming here seeking safety.

## Know Thy Vestry: Sandra Read



**Parking for Worship:** Free parking for Sunday worship is provided:

- 1.) in the lot diagonally across Westminster Street, on the NW corner of Westminster and Snow;
  - 2.) On the **top level only** of the PPAC parking garage, for which the entrance is on Weybosset Street. A stairway from the top level leads right to Chapel Street across from the church; and
  - 3.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.


## Come and Sing with the Summer Choir
