Spotlight on Grace: All Saints' and All Souls'

November 1st (or the Sunday following) is celebrated as the Feast of All Saints in The Episcopal Church and many others - a day when we celebrate the saints of God, famous and totally unknown, beginning with the apostles themselves. The next day is All Souls' Day, when we remember all the faithful departed. As we've done for years, in honor of these days of remembrance, we invite everyone to bring a photo of a departed loved one to church to place on the high altar. If you'd rather, though, you can simply bring a photo to church with you on Sunday and have it with you in your pew as you remember and give thanks for the life of that loved one and the joy they brought you in this life.



In the Christian faith we neither worship our ancestors nor the saints. We may (and countless Christians do) pray to God through the saints, as we believe the saints live still in God's presence. And while we don't worship our ancestors (we worship only God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit), we certainly remember our departed loved ones, give thanks for them, and often draw strength and comfort, not just from their memory, but from the knowledge that they too, like all those saints whose names we know and whose feast days we celebrate, are with God and that we will see them again in due course, when we ourselves have finished our earthly pilgrimage.

The word, "eucharist" is Greek for "thanksgiving," and the worship we offer to God each Sunday is centered on giving thanks to the Lord. On this Sunday, we give thanks to God for those we have loved but see no longer. The experience of having loved and lost is, if you're over a certain age, universal. On Sunday, we will gather together to share that most human experience - to give thanks, perhaps to grieve, and to look forward in hope to when we will meet again on that distant shore, in the nearer presence of God.

We invite you to bring in pictures of deceased loved ones to place on the high altar that day. You may place them on the altar yourself or ask a greeter or usher to help you before the service. Please collect the pictures after worship.
