Bishop Knisely will preach and celebrate



Advent Small Group Series




North Providence, and Cranston, as well as one group that will meet at 9 a.m. on Sunday mornings at Grace. Please join us for whatever group works best for you!

GivePlus is a mobile giving app that enables you to make one-time or recurring gifts from your smartphone (watch this video tutorial). Visit the App Store or Google Play and search for "GivePlus" to download the app, search for "Grace Church Providence" in the app, choose which fund you'd like to support (Pledge, Music at Grace, etc.), and you're on your way.



Those accustomed to texting may enjoy giving through Give+ Text. Make one-time or recurring offerings by simply sending a text to our secure account at **401-298-9775**. 
Weekly Worship Schedule:

The Grace Church Inreach Ministry


