That generosity is more than how we share what we have, how we welcome the stranger or foreigner, and how we forgive those who have offended us. Living generously can transform our lives and transform our communities. It is a way of praising God for all we have been given.

Reflection Questions: When have you experienced a miracle in your life? How have you responded? What is your favorite way of showing gratitude?
