Spotlight on Grace: A Message on the Election from the Rector

This has been an unprecedented presidential election, and many of us - in our amazingly diverse parish - are anxious about what the future holds for us and for those we love. I myself was so overwhelmed while leading the noon eucharist yesterday, that I had to turn to the parishioner next to me and ask her to take over the leading of the prayers, which she graciously did.

I am committed to our church being both a sanctuary and a beacon for all: a place that rejoices in its diversity as a reflection of the Kingdom of God. That is what Grace is and what Grace will continue to be. As parishioner Rob Walsh-Simoes said in his

wonderful address to the congregation on Sunday about what he and his husband Ron found here at Grace, "You have made us feel like we belong...but more importantly, we have found our place with God because of Grace."

We all - no matter who we are, or what we look like, or what we have, or whom we love, or where we come from - have our place with God here at Grace. Let us also pray that our nation would be a place where everyone feels at home. St. Paul teaches us that, as Christians, we are to have no distinctions between us: "There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:28) In Grace Church, as in the Christian Church itself, we are unified in our faith in Christ and diverse in almost every other way! Let us pray that our nation may also celebrate its diversity across countless categories while being united in our love for this land, and in our commitment to the ideals of this great republic. In this time, we ought to remember the words of Abraham Lincoln, who said to the nation in his Second Inaugural Address, "let us


strive on to finish the work we are in, to bind up the nation's wounds...to do all which may achieve and cherish a just and lasting peace among ourselves and with all nations."

And let us, in this time of anxiety for so many, be guided by the words of the apostle Paul, who said, "Let your gentleness be known to all, the Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer with thanksgiving let your requests be known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses understanding, will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:5-7) May our hearts and minds be on Christ, that we may love each other and build up our community and nation.


