

Spotlight on Grace: The Rector's Christmas Message



The two days of the year that draw the most people to church are, hands down, Easter and Christmas. Of the two, Christmas is by far the more celebrated in our cultural life.

There are many reasons for that, but one of them may be that while Easter celebrates triumph or victory (in this case, the victory of Christ over death), Christmas celebrates hope (in this case, the hope for peace and redemption in the birth of Jesus). As human beings, perhaps we gravitate more easily to hope than victory.

Hope is sustaining, and all of us need sustaining. Hope allows us to take to our beds at

the end of a bad day with, as the old Prayer Book says, "a reasonable and holy hope" that there is a better tomorrow ahead of us. When our hearts sink at news of attacks on churches in Egypt or Christmas markets in Germany, it is hope that keeps us from falling into grief or despair. If we fear what lies ahead for our own country, the spirit of hope that pervades the Christmas story ought to lift our spirits to know that God will be with us in the years to come, just as we ought to be with, and for, each other. Martin Luther King, Jr. famously said, "The arc of history is long, but it bends towards justice."



Wherever we are as a people on that arc right now, we will continue to set our eyes on the horizon that brings justice and peace. And the Prince of Peace, whose star shone to give light to travelers from near and far, whose birth gave light to the world, will continue to light our

way forward.

Please take time out from your day at Noon on Thursday, January 5 for a special concert featuring Fred Jodry on the Grace Church organ. He will perform *La Nativite du Seigneur* by Olivier Messiaen, which features a series of meditations on the birth of our Lord.

Fred Jodry is the Director of Choral Activities at Brown University, founder of Schola Cantorum (a 12-voice ensemble dedicated to the performance of Renaissance sacred music), and Music Director at First Unitarian Church in



Providence. On April 7, 2017, he will conduct a special performance here at Grace Church of <u>Bach's St. Matthew Passion</u> featuring the Brown University Chorus and Schola Cantorum together with the Choristers of Grace Church. This will be the Gala Finale of the 50th Season of *Museum Concerts*.
