


What's a Parish?

In the Episcopal Church we throw around the word "parish" a lot. But what does it mean?

These days at least, it's largely synonymous with the words "church" or "congregation," and essentially means the local worshipping community.

Historically though, parish was a geographical term, and that's the way it's still used in Lousiana, where it essentially corresponds to the word "county." In England, the word "parish" means a geographical area centered on a specific church. That means that English priests can say something you rarely hear an American priest say: "I have many Hindus in my parish." In theory, anyone residing within the bounds of an English parish - no matter what their religion - a "parishioner" of that church!



Complicating things still further, in the Episcopal Church, the word "parish" indicates a certain type of church, specifically one that is self-supporting and has the right to elect its own rector and vestry (as opposed to a "mission church"). Having said all that, when you say, "Grace is my parish," you are essentially saying the same thing as "Grace is my church." And we're happy when you say either one!


Wheelchair Access and Accessible Parking: Please find convenient accessible in the Grace Church parking lot with access from Snow Street. The new wheelchair ramp connects directly from the lot, and you will enter through the new reception entrance of The Pavilion and into the church at ground level.

Parking for Worship: Free parking for Sunday worship is provided:

- 1.) in the lot diagonally across Westminster Street, on the NW corner of Westminster and Snow;
- 2.) On the **top level only** of the PPAC parking garage, for which the entrance is on Weybosset Street. A stairway from the top level leads right to Chapel Street across from the church; and
- 3.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.




