

Spotlight on Grace: Looking Back as we Look Ahead



The space along Westminster Street that Grace Church's new 'Great Hall' and cloister garden will soon occupy has quite a storied past. The old postcard at left shows the Nickel Theatre, which reportedly debuted as the first regular movie operation in Providence on April 18, 1906... the same day as the San Francisco earthquake.

As a sidenote, Grace Church itself was constructed in 1846 on the site where

the old Providence Theater once stood. In 1832, the parishioners of Grace church purchased and modified that theater, though just over a decade later that smaller structure was moved off the site to make way for our beloved present-day Richard Upjohn church.

But certainly, of the theaters that have stood on this ground, none approximated the splendor of the E.F. Albee Theatre. The Albee was completed in 1919, and began showing movies in 1925 following the installation of a Wurlitzer organ. According to one researcher: "By the late 1950's, as with all other downtown palaces across the land, the Albee Theatre went into a decline. In 1965 the life of the R.K.O. Albee Theatre as a movie theatre came to an end. As one of the reasons, the management cited the competition from area drive-in theatres."


During the demolition of the Albee Theatre in June of 1970, as many of our parishioners may indeed recall, a wall collapse damaged an adjacent portion of the nave of Grace Church.

People have long gathered in this lot adjacent to Grace Church. Between 1906 and 1965, they gathered for entertainment. Even once the space was reduced to mere



asphalt, Grace parishioners came together here for fellowship and ministry as our 'coffee

hour' following the principal Sunday service moved outdoors annually in season. Today, as we work to construct our new 'Great Hall' and cloister garden, the stage will soon be set for generations of joyous gatherings yet to come. 
Open Doors Ministry: The Open Doors Ministry will return next week, likely by midweek. Thank you for your understanding through this initial phase of construction.



program is in direct response to lay people who are seeking ways to discern and understand their God given purpose. Cost for the entire series is \$100. Please click here for a listing of all 7 session times.


