


# Spotlight on Grace: The Power of Living Generously




Psalm 112 speaks eloquently about the theme of "Living Generously." It defines generous living as being gracious, merciful and righteous. To live in such a way, we are to conduct our lives with justice.

Generous living is much more than what we do with our money. We are called to be kind to one another and to all living things. We are called to deal with each other honestly... and to be humble.

We believe each of us is called to live wildly generous lives, and that such generous living can transform us and our faith communities.

Over the next several weeks, we will explore the idea of Living Generously as the focus of our Stewardship campaign for 2017. We invite you to begin to reflect upon what living generously means to you, and how you have experienced (or hope to experience) the transformative power of generous living.

This week, we celebrate the life and legacy of St. Francis, who so graciously espoused his love and devotion for Christ and all of God's creation that -- for eight centuries and counting -- Christians worldwide have been inspired



to live generously by his example. As we recall St. Francis this week, let us consider these words ascribed to him: "For people lose everything they leave behind in this world; but they carry with them the rewards of charity and the alms which they gave".

This Sunday, October 2, we honor the legacy of St. Francis of Assisi at the 10:00am service with our annual Blessing of the Animals here at Grace Church. We encourage you to attend, and you are most welcome to bring your beloved pets to receive God's blessing.



#### Wheelchair Access and Accessible Parking:




