

Feast of the Epiphany

Like almost every church, Grace celebrates the Lord's Day by worshipping together every Sunday of the year. We also celebrate other "feast days" of the Church, like Christmas and Easter, and, like many churches, we worship together on other days as well - such as Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday. Some Christian churches recognize many more such days than we do - an Ethiopian friend of mine once told me that in the Ethiopian Orthodox Church more than half the days of the year are set aside as either a feast day or a fast day!



At Grace Church this Sunday, we will do something we do once every seven years - we will celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany on the day itself - January 6. We will do so because, this year, January 6th falls on a Sunday. Normally, we celebrate Epiphany on the Sunday following the 6th, but not this year! Epiphany - from the Greek for "appearance" - is a celebration of Christ's appearing to the gentiles in two ways: through the arrival of the magi at the manger in Bethlehem following the birth of Jesus and through the revealing of Christ as God's son at his baptism by John in the River Jordan 30 years later. Because of that second aspect of the feast of the Epiphany, it is traditional to baptize on that day, as we will do here at Grace on Sunday.

I encourage you all to worship at Grace every Sunday of the year, of course, but inviting you to church on the Feast of the Epiphany itself is something I do only once every seven years! So join us on Sunday to celebrate the arrival of the wise men in Bethlehem - the traditional culmination of the Christmas season - and to welcome multiple young people into the Church through the sacrament of baptism...and to celebrate not only that Christ was born for us but that he has been made known to us.

Lessons & Carols for Epiphany




Please join us for a Service of Lessons & Carols for Epiphany, Sunday, January 6, 2019, at 4:00pm in Grace Church.

from Snow Street. The new wheelchair ramp connects directly from the lot, and you will enter through the new reception entrance of The Pavilion and into the church at ground level.


Parking for Worship: Free parking for Sunday worship is provided:

- 1.) in the lot diagonally across Westminster Street, on the NW corner of Westminster and Snow;
- 2.) On the **top level only** of the PPAC parking garage, for which the entrance is on Weybosset Street. A stairway from the top level leads right to Chapel Street across from the church; and
- 3.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.




