We have already seen that The Pavilion will be a sought-after space for wedding receptions. We have been inundated with inquiries and site tours for wedding couples, and bookings for 2018 and 2019 are beginning to materialize. During the weekend, we will join the brothers in worship in the monastery chapel, take our meals with them, and meet with one of the monks, Br. Luke, who will usher us through the retreat with four group sessions, first with an orientation Friday evening. Saturday he will share some reflections,



Parking for Worship: Free parking for Sunday worship is provided:


1.) in the lot diagonally across Westminster Street, on the NW corner of Westminster and Snow;

2.) On the **top level only** of the PPAC parking garage, for which the entrance is on Weybosset Street. A stairway from the top level leads right to Chapel Street across from the church; and

3.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.

March 4, 2018 Third Sunday in Lent


