## Spotlight on Grace: Palm Sunday Message from the Rector



In many churches, it's traditional to have Palm Sunday processions outside - to recall the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem - when the weather is good. "Good weather" is a relative term, but for this purpose, I take it to mean at least 55 degrees and no rain. In my eight years at Grace Church, I have never seen a Palm Sunday with "good weather," and we likely won't see one this year. But as we're "driven inside" again for at least the 8th straight Palm Sunday, perhaps there's some message in our "interior" celebration.

We will proclaim Christ in all the seasons of our lives, in times of good weather and bad, in times of grief and times of joy. The Christian Church itself has witnessed periods of "interior worship" when it was too dangerous to worship publicly, as was often the case in the Soviet Union and is still in parts of the world today. Fleeing inclement weather is nothing like fleeing Soviet persecution, of course, but perhaps as we process through the inside of our church on Palm Sunday, we can remember our brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the centuries and across the world who have gathered in hope, when all outside indicators suggested that hope was lost. Because from that very first Easter Day, when the risen Christ appeared to the disciples in the Upper Room when they were struggling to hold on to even the smallest shred of hope, Jesus has given us cause to gather together in his name, his hope, and his love.



1.) in the lot diagonally across Westminster Street, on the NW corner of Westminster and Snow;



3.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.


