



## Spotlight on Grace: *Hey, Where'd the Altar Go?*

Some of you may have noticed that the altar we've been using on Sundays wasn't there on Easter morning, and instead we were using the "high altar". Here's an explanation of why that is:



Until the 1960's, most Episcopal and Roman Catholic churches in this country had "east facing" altars, where the priest celebrated the eucharist with his back to the congregation. Around that time, though, many churches decided it would be better for the priest to face the people. Many churches pulled their altars away from the back wall so the priest could stand behind it to face the people.

In some churches, that was nearly impossible; and Grace is one of those churches. The high altar -- built in 1912 when the chancel was constructed -- is made of solid marble, and affixed to the back wall of the church. So years ago, a compromise was struck that we would install a table altar and movable communion rails at the

"crossing" of the church, and use that altar for most of the year. We would then return to the high altar for the Christmas and Easter seasons each year (about 8 Sundays out of 52), so that worshippers would have the experience of taking communion at the historic high altar of Grace Church, and cross through the choir as they approached the altar.

On Trinity Sunday (May 22 this year), look for the table altar to return to its usual place. While we're at the high altar, our intention is to have each Sunday a standing communion station at the foot of the pulpit, just as we did on Easter, for anyone who would rather not navigate the chancel steps.




## Looking Ahead


