Spotlight on Grace: Enhancing a Sacred Space

Work is well underway in the sacristy of Grace Church that will enhance both the look and functionality of this special space that so directly supports our worship. For those who may not be familiar with Grace's sacristy, it's located right next to the rector's office and just off the vestry, and it is home turf, so to speak, for our treasured altar guild.

The new cabinetry shown at right replaces some previously underutilized space near the newly repaired sacristy sink, and the room's well trodden floors will receive a fresh finish. The portion of the room that was built by Cram in 1912 remains as original, while these improvements to the portion of the room that was added sometime after 1912 will create a look and feel that are far more complimentary to Cram's work.

The improvements are being made

thanks in part to a memorial donation by altar guild member Gail Kenney, and once completed the room will bear a plaque in memory of Gail's husband and parents.




model have sprung up around the country, linked cooperatively to a national organization dedicated to supporting these Villages.



2.) On the **top level only** of the PPAC parking garage, for which the entrance is on Weybosset Street. A stairway from the top level leads right to Chapel Street across from the church; and

3.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.


Enroll for Summer Programs at ECC
