Spotlight on Grace: Celebrate the Birth of the Church

Pentecost is the annual celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples 50 days after the resurrection of Christ. It is also traditionally considered the birthday of the Christian Church. Why is that? Why would the Church not consider its birthday to be, say, Christmas or Easter? Or even the baptism of Jesus by John in the River Jordan?

The Feast of Pentecost marks the birth of the Church because of at least two things that happened on that day, 50 days after the resurrection of Jesus. First, through the coming of the Holy Spirit, God was present with the followers of Jesus from that moment on, whether they were experiencing tangible miracles or not. When we gather together in prayer and mission in the name of Jesus, God's Holy Spirit is with us, and that is what the Church is meant to be - God and God's people together in mission, following Jesus.

Second, the Pentecost experience in that upper room in Jerusalem all those years ago was deliberately diverse. The Church is meant to be universal rather than the faith of one ethnic, national, or linguistic group. (On Sunday, we will celebrate that diversity in our own parish through a multi-lingual Gospel reading.) The Church is not the Church unless it is outward-reaching and embracing. On that Day of Pentecost, when all those people were gathered together - divided by language but united in faith - that would also mark the Church as the Church.

God's active presence in our ministry on this earth, as well reflecting the diversity of all humanity (and reaching out to all of humanity) - these things make the Church what it is meant to be, and so the Feast of Pentecost is indeed a very good day to consider as the birthday of the Church. We look forward to celebrating our birthday with you on Sunday!

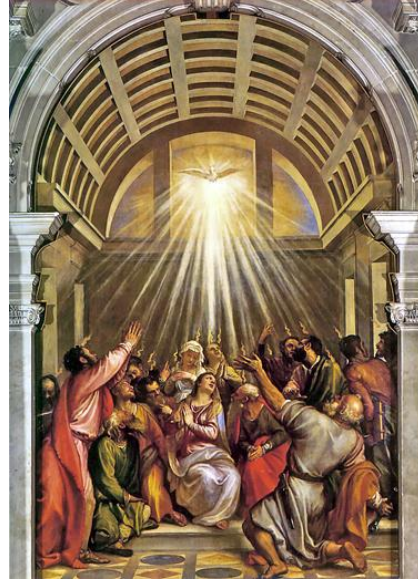
Open Doors:
