

### **Spotlight on Grace: From the Director of Music**



Most churches have choirs, and choirs need music to sing!

Church choir directors are responsible for obtaining (mostly purchasing) sheet music for their choirs to sing, and over the years collections can grow to substantial scale. Certainly, this has been the case at Grace Church. The strong history of choral singing at Grace has demanded that many copies of music be available for choir members.

It's not uncommon for church music libraries to go for some time without a concerted process of review, organization, purging, etc. After almost a year as the Director of Music, I felt it was time to get the library here at Grace in order. This involves several steps.

Each anthem (mostly in library boxes at Grace) must be examined to make sure the correct anthem is in the correct box. Many of the boxes, made of cardboard, need dusting and repair. A great number of the boxes have either the wrong anthem, or no anthem in them at all! Perhaps the most important task is ridding the library of photocopies. Most music is copyrighted and must be purchased - one copy for every singer. While this can be an expensive prospect for growing choirs, it is the only ethical and legal way to build a library. Over the past 50 years, many choir libraries were filled with photocopies, mostly because people were not as aware of copyright law. I'm happy to say that as of this week, all unauthorized photocopied music has been removed from the Grace choir library, destroyed and recycled.

Music can also simply "age out". Being made of paper, this is unavoidable. We have had to remove a number of anthems which literally crumble in the hands. By the time the choir year resumes in September, there will be a completely organized library, in file boxes and cabinets. The entire library is also being entered into a spreadsheet, so we will be able to search an anthem by title, composer, keyword, library number, voicing, scriptural reference

or liturgical season. Please feel free to stop by on a Sunday after church to see this library work in progress!




