Needing only a pot, a spoon and a cooking service, Grace to Go will help feed the neediest in our community, who are looking for their next healthy meal.



A Final Touch for The Pavilion at Grace

As you arrive for Sunday worship this weekend, you might take note of some curious-looking arched structures perched outside in the garden. Next week, those pieces will be assembled to form an attractive 13-foot tall pergola over the entrance walkway between the front gate and the double-door entrance at the front of The Pavilion.

Envisaged from the start as an important anchoring element of the overall design, the pergola will accent the structure beautifully,



and those currently booking The Pavilion for wedding receptions and other events are thrilled that we'll have it. The pergola will become wrapped in living vegetation, provide welcome shade, and create a dramatic welcome for visitors and guests. Its final color will be a pleasant green to complement both the vegetation and the eventual hue of the Pavilion itself. The

same talented craftsman from Silverlake Iron Works who created the fence for the garden will bring this final element of Centerbrook's award-winning design to completion.





Pavilion. Please enter through the pavilion's entrance gate at Westminster Street, or through the reception entrance off our Chapel St parking lot.



- 3.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.


The National Alliance on Mental Illness is the nation's largest grassroots mental health organization dedicated to building better lives for the millions of Americans affected by mental
