

### Spotlight on Grace: The Engravings of Andrew Raftery




Andrew Raftery: contemporary artist, master engraver and printmak er, RISD professor, gardener, Grace Church studio tenant, and volunteer curator of Grace Church's collection of historical prints by Edna W. Lawrence (1898-1987).

Within his studio space right above the Chafee Room here at Grace, artist Andrew Raftery creates meticulous engraved masterpieces that pair contemporary narratives with time-honored technique.

A professor of printmaking at RISD since 1991, Andrew is <u>an accomplished artist</u> whose works can be found among collections of the British Museum in London, the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the New York Public Library, and the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, to name a few.

Andrew will celebrate the culmination of an eight-year artistic journey next month with a major exhibition at the <u>Ryan Lee Gallery</u> in New York City. The exhibition and its subject portfolio are titled: <u>Autobiography of a Garden on Twelve Engraved Plates</u>; and features "ceramics, paintings, and installation based on the annual garden that he designs, plants, and tends in Providence, Rhode Island". Andrew even created a hand-printed letterpress wallpaper to accompany the engraved plates. The exhibition will run September 10 - November 5, with an opening Sept. 10 from 4-6PM.

When speaking with Andrew, it quickly becomes clear that he has a special place in his heart for Grace Church, and after nearly 14 years creating artwork out of this studio he has established a strong sense of place here.

Many longtime parishioners might recall another prominent local artist, who was likewise on the faculty at RISD (for 53 years), and who likewise adored Grace Church. Edna W. Lawrence (1898-1987) was a gifted parishioner who created wonderful illustrations of various artistic and/or architectural details within and outside the church, which she later donated to Grace. Her sketch at left of a woodcarving detail from the chancel is one of

many in the collection that convey the beauty of Grace through a patchwork of exquisite details. Is is with great devotion that Andrew stewards this collection for Grace Church, and we are grateful for that stewardship. - by <u>Chris Barker</u>, Parish Administrator.



**Nursery:** Please note that the nursery will not be available this Sunday, August 28. The nursery will return September 4.



# **Music at Grace**

The Fall music program at Grace gets underway Sunday, September 11 with the return of the full adult choir, and please join us in welcoming the Grace Church Choristers! We also look forward to the return of our informal half-hour concerts Thursdays at Noon, which for the



Fall will run from September 14 through November 18. Late next week we'll be mailing out the full music program schedule through Spring 2017; so please keep an eye out in your mailbox.

It is with great excitement that I announce the formation of a new professional chamber choir -- made up of talented singers from all over Rhode Island -- which will be our ensemble-in-residence here at Grace Church. The group will be called Collegium Ancora, which chosen for a several reasons. Collegium means "a group whose members pursue shared goals", and ancora is Latin for hope and anchor, both of which elements of the Rhode Island state seal.

While Collegium Ancora will focus on sacred a cappella music, the group will have quite a diverse repertoire. Tickets are not required in advance, though a \$10 per person donation is suggested at the door. Please mark your calendars for the 2016-17 concert season of Collegium Ancora:


The following items are needed: construction paper, children's books (ages 3-5), writing paper, glue sticks/craft glue,


