Spotlight on Grace: Note from the Rector


Friends,

First of all, I'm thrilled to be back with you all at Grace Church! I suspect I would have felt this way whenever I'd returned to Grace after three months away, but this year is an especially exciting period in the life of our parish. The biggest (literally) thing happening at Grace this year is, of course, the construction of the new building. A project like this happens roughly once a century, and I feel (as I suspect you do) blessed to be a part of both the construction itself and the new possibilities for ministry here in downtown Providence that our new building will enable.



As I said to you all before leaving on my sabbatical, I want to tell you again: thank you for giving me this gift of three months in a different rhythm of life. This summer I've made an initial attempt to learn Spanish. In fact, the program I've been using - Duolingo - tells me that I'm now 29% fluent, though if I were to wake up tomorrow in Havana, I suspect I'd understand much less than 29% of what's being said around me! But I've begun to get a feel for the language and hope to keep working on it in the future. The sabbatical also gave me a chance to read books which have until now sat lonely on my shelf, and I had much more family time and time with old friends from far away than I normally do. Another opportunity that my sabbatical afforded me was the chance to worship in different churches. I went to a Quaker meeting and several Episcopal churches in various locations this summer. In the span of three weeks on Cape Cod, I heard sermons (all excellent) from two cathedral deans and a bishop!

There is no one intended effect of a clergy sabbatical, nor is there one universal outcome. Some ministers, while on sabbatical, envision a new direction for the ministry of their parish or for their own ministry. Some seek new skills or experiences. Some return to their parish having become convinced that the time away was so refreshing that it's time to retire! I still have almost 20 years before my pension vests, so that last one's not in the cards.



For me, perhaps more than anything, the effect of my sabbatical is best illustrated by the old saying, "Absence makes the heart grow fonder." My absence from Grace (and from our home and city and state) has instilled in me in a renewed sense of how blessed I am to be in this place...and with all of you.

I thank you all for the time away, and I thank God for having sent me to Grace. I look forward to this "new year", and to the exciting work we will do together in this place with God's blessing.



Wheelchair Access and Accessible Parking:



Music at Grace

It is with great excitement that I announce the formation of a new professional chamber choir



-- made up of talented singers from all over Rhode Island -- which will be our ensemble-in-residence here at Grace Church. Collegium means "a group whose members pursue shared goals", and ancora is Latin for hope and anchor, both of which elements of the Rhode Island state seal.

Final Week of our Back to School Supply Drive





From The Episcopal Church

Highlights for September 4, 2016 from the Episcopal Digital Network:

On Sunday, September 4, the Episcopal Church celebrates the life and legacy of notable saint, **the Reverend Alexander Crummell**. This day is also designated as Union of Black Episcopalians (UBE) Sunday to commemorate the racial justice ministry of this organization which was an outgrowth of Crummell's advocacy.



As a young man, Crummell was driven out of an academy in New Hampshire, dismissed as a candidate for Holy Orders in New York, and rejected for admittance to General Seminary because of his race. He was eventually ordained in 1844 as a priest in the Diocese of Massachusetts, but left for England after being excluded from participating in diocesan convention.

Ever determined, Crummell studied at Queens' College, Cambridge and was the first officially black student recorded as graduating. Soon after, he traveled to Liberia as a missionary to convert native Africans to Christianity and educate them, as well as to persuade American black community of their duty to go to Africa to spread Christianity across the continent. Crummell lived and worked for 20 years in Liberia. Finally, political opposition, lack of funding, and the potential for life-threatening violence forced him to return to the United States.
