## From the Director of Music

Thursday Noon Organ Concerts! Please join Director of Music Vince Edwards for informal half-hour organ concerts at noon on Thursdays, beginning October 8. Feel free to come for the entire concert or just a few minutes. Invite a friend to join you, and share the beauty of Grace Church and the mighty organ!

<u>Did you know</u> . . . . that the Grace Church organ has over 6000 individual pipes arranged in the front (chancel) and back (nave/gallery) of the church? Did you know . . . that the beautiful walnut gallery organ case and stenciled pipes date to 1886? Did you know . . . that the organ console (keyboards and command center) is so large that the organist uses cameras and a video screen to see what is happening during the Sunday service?

The Choir of Grace Church is growing! We have 27 dedicated members in the choir but there's room for more! If you've considered singing in the choir or know someone who is a good candidate, please speak to Vince Edwards, Director of Music or email him at vedwards@gracechurchprovidence.org.
