Holy Week Message from the Rector

On Sunday we enter into Holy Week at Grace Church, beginning with our celebration of Palm Sunday. Palm Sunday is also known as the Sunday of the Passion, because the Church appoints it as the day on which we read the "Passion Narrative," that is, the portion of the Gospels that tells the events of the last day of Christ's earthly life.



Of course, most of us associate Palm Sunday with, well, palms, which we bless and carry in church that day in remembrance of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem that preceded the events of the Passion. It is, therefore, the only day of the year that we have two Gospel readings in church. The reason we have the Passion reading on Palm Sunday is because the Church knows that not everyone will be in church on Good Friday (when we hear the Passion narrative again). But, if your schedule permits, I encourage you to attend church not just Good Friday, but as many services this coming week as you can. We have unique worship services every day next week (see the schedule below), and in keeping with long tradition at Grace, we will have a guest preacher on Good Friday, The Rev. Elizabeth Chandler Felts, the new senior minister at our neighboring church, Beneficent Congregational.

For the first time in the 8 years I've been at Grace, it looks like Palm Sunday could have weather good enough that we could actually have a procession outside (a centuries-old Christian practice for Palm Sunday). If so, we'll gather in the Pavilion and process through our garden out onto Westminster Street and through the main doors of the Church. If the weather is bad, we'll process around the inside of the church instead!

I look forward to joining with you all in our journey through Holy Week, remembering and

giving thanks for all that God has done for us through Jesus Christ.

Holy Week this year begins on April 14 (Palm Sunday), with Easter Sunday therefore following on April 21. For the most immersive experience of Holy Week, we encourage you to consider attending each of the services of the Holy Triduum if you are able: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil.

Embracing the Episcopal Vision of Creation Care at Grace Church



April is "Earth Month", with Earth Day on April 22, and April 5 - 14 designated as *Faith Climate Action Week* by [Interfaith Power & Light](#). So, it is fitting that we at Grace Church take a look at the commitment that the Episcopal Church has made to "safeguard the integrity of Creation and to sustain and renew the life of the Earth."

"As a whole church, we have promised to place the care of God's Creation at the heart of our common life," states [the Episcopal Church's webpage on Creation Care](#). "Together, we have taken up church-wide action in order to safeguard the integrity of Creation and to sustain and renew the life of the Earth."

The Presiding Bishop's Office and the Advisory Council on Stewardship of Creation developed three goals for the Care of Creation:

Loving - Goal #1 - Create and sustain a network of Episcopalians dedicated to the care and protection of the whole Creation.

Liberating - Goal #2 - Stand in solidarity with the most vulnerable victims of the impact of climate change -- particularly women, poor people, and people of color -- as part of seeking the liberation and flourishing of all God's people.

Life-Giving - Goal #3 - Set climate mitigation benchmarks as individuals and as a church, in order to live more simply, humbly, and gently on the Earth.

Our Sunday School children and Youth Group will be learning about Creation Care and what we can do to protect our Earth from the impacts of climate change. On Sunday, April 27th, we will have an information table for parishioners with fact sheets about climate change, post cards to send to elected officials, and copies of the Episcopal Church's Creation Pledge that you are invited to sign and make your own commitment to Creation Care.

Our Good Friday Preacher

The Good Friday service will be held at Noon on Friday, April 19. This year's Good Friday preacher will be the Rev. Elizabeth Chandler Felts. Rev. Felts became the Senior Minister of our neighbor church on Weybosset Street, Beneficent Congregational Church, three months ago. As an undergraduate at Northwestern University, Rev. Felts majored in religion, where she graduated with departmental honors. She is a graduate of Harvard Divinity School where she won the Hopkins Share for Ministerial Promise and the Billings Prize for Pulpit Delivery. Ordained in the United Church of Christ, Rev. Felts served churches in Boston, Chicago, and San Francisco, and was active in the UCC on national, conference, and association levels and organized extensively in local interfaith communities. Prior to her arrival at Beneficent, Rev. Felts served as a hospice chaplain in California. Following the Noon service, the church will remain open for prayer until 3 pm.


Parking for Worship: Free parking for Sunday worship is provided:

- 3.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.
