

Spotlight on Grace: An Invitation to the Triduum



The services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil (collectively called "The Triduum" by the Church), can be profoundly moving, as they recall, in our worship, the final days of Christ's life.

Maundy Thursday celebrates the institution of the Lord's Supper (the Eucharist), and Jesus' washing of his disciples' feet, and the congregation is invited (though not at all required) to wash the feet of another and have

their own feet washed as well.

The noon service at Good Friday is our time as a community to remember Christ's sacrifice on the cross, and when we welcome a guest preacher (see below) into our pulpit, as we've done for decades.

The next day, the Easter Vigil, at 8:00 on Saturday evening, begins with hopeful waiting in near darkness and moves into the celebration of the Resurrection of Christ, full of light, music, and joy. The Vigil is a unique worship experience in the church year, and I hope many of you will be moved to attend.

I look forward to traveling these three days in the life of Christ and the Church with you all here at Grace.

Our Good Friday Preacher

The Good Friday service will be held at Noon on Friday, April 19. This year's Good Friday preacher will be the Rev. Elizabeth Chandler Felts. Rev. Felts became the Senior Minister of our neighbor church on Weybosset Street, Beneficent Congregational Church, three months ago. As an undergraduate at Northwestern University, Rev. Felts majored in religion, where she graduated with departmental honors. She is a graduate of Harvard Divinity School where she won the Hopkins Share for Ministerial Promise and the Billings Prize for Pulpit Delivery. Ordained in the United Church of Christ, Rev. Felts served churches in Boston, Chicago, and San Francisco, and was active in the UCC on national, conference, and association levels and organized extensively in local interfaith communities. Prior to



her arrival at Beneficent, Rev. Felts served as a hospice chaplain in California.
