

Spotlight on Grace: A Remembrance of The Rev. Bob Brooks by The Rev. Meaghan Brower

I was the youth group leader at Grace when Bob came on as the new rector, but when he first arrived I wasn't sure about him. He was kind of... corporate. I learned very quickly, however, that Bob broke the mold, and he taught me more than I could have ever hoped to learn from a priest, mentor, and friend.

When Bob first started in his role, I would get emails from him that appeared short and cold. Then one day I sat by him as he sent an email out. I watched as he painstakingly hit the keys with his two pointer fingers - typing at the slowest pace I had ever seen. I realized his "cold" emails were short by necessity, and that the man who seemed like he could do anything still had a couple of gaps. **Bob taught me that you didn't have to be great at everything, you just had to be honest about what you could and could not bring to the table.**



Another day when in his office for a meeting, I noticed that he had an extra phone next to his office phone on his desk. This was 20 years ago, and I simply assumed it was the phone you needed to dial up to the internet and get your AOL account going. Then extra phone rang. He stopped our conversation to answer, and gave stilted responses: "yes, yes, 5pm. Ok. Love you." Hanging up the phone he looked at me and said "that's Rhea's line." I laughed as I realized the guy who was so clearly a boss had a direct line for the real boss in his life. **Bob taught me that after God, your spouse comes first, and it's okay to do whatever it takes to tend to your beloved.**

What I ultimately came to learn was that Bob wasn't "corporate", but instead was bold and straight-forward and refreshingly honest, and it helped him to get so many things done. He helped so many of us to become the best version of ourselves, including me, when he so directly said "Meg, I think you should be a priest, just tell me when you're ready." **Bob taught me that sometimes people are too scared to say yes to what God has in store for them,**

and we can help with that yes.

Like so many of you, my life will be forever changed because of the way he showed me God's abundant love. He was an incredible priest, mentor, and friend.

May he rest in peace, and rise in glory.

Styrofoam Recyclables Collected Once per Month

Beginning this Sunday, September 1, and *solely* on the first Sunday of every month thereafter, Grace Church will collect your carefully cleaned and dried styrofoam recyclables in a blue recycling barrel that will be placed outside the office entrance to The Pavilion, next to the handicapped ramp.



Items such as styrofoam coffee cups, take-out food containers, rigid styrofoam padding from packages (but not those foam packing peanuts, which are not recyclable), foam meat trays, etc., can be recycled through this special program. Key to the success of this program will be your cooperation in ensuring items are thoroughly cleaned and dried before drop-off.

Please be sure to **ONLY** bring foam recyclables on the first Sunday of a calendar month, as no recyclables will be collected on any other day. And please do not place recyclables of any other variety in the blue barrel... it is exclusively for styrofoam recyclables.

A Sunday Respite for the Summer Choir
