

September 29 is the Feast of St. Michael and All Angels, and since that falls on a Sunday this year, we're going to celebrate it in church!


What this means for our worshipping community is the opportunity to sing some wonderful hymns, and for the choir to sing a special anthem, *Factum est silentium* by Renaissance composer Richard Dering. This dramatic anthem portrays through text and music the battle between St. Michael and the dragon (representative of the devil), or the battle between good and evil.

In addition, this week we welcome the Right Reverend Nicholas Knisely, Bishop of Rhode Island, for his annual visitation. He will preach at both the 8AM and 10AM services. During the 10AM service, Bishop Knisely will confirm and receive four new members into the Episcopal Church. Join us for this mighty celebration! 
20s & 30s Group Potluck

1.) in the lot diagonally across Westminster Street, on the NW corner of Westminster and




Snow; and
