Spotlight on Grace: Letter from the Senior Warden

Dear Grace Church Family,

We've arrived at my favorite season of the year. Not fall, although I do love the excitement that comes with the opening of a new academic year, as sweater weather becomes the new normal. No, I mean Stewardship Season. If you hear the word "stewardship" and cringe, I get it: too often, in too many places, it is a synonym for "fundraising." I think that is a horrible



distortion of the concept, and I'd like to share a

few thoughts about what I believe stewardship is really all about.

Going right back to the Creation story in Genesis, God's people are told to be caretakers - stewards - of the earth and every living creature. I've checked very carefully, and there's no mention in there about ponying up cash to keep Eden running. Things get a lot more difficult after the whole snake-and-apple episode, but at that point God's request is that we all bring the first fruits of our lives and labors to Him, with thanksgiving: the first reaping of grain, the first-born lambs of the flock.

Being a steward means to be a fiduciary, a fifty-cent word that includes the notions of custody and responsibility. We're entrusted with Grace's buildings and our programs, of course, but also with the astonishing and potent promise of resurrection, at which time God expects us to explain how we handled all those responsibilities. Have we been good and faithful servants? Have we found a way to benefit others, those of our own household as well as the stranger, the widow, the orphan, the imprisoned, the destitute?

In this Sunday's Gospel passage from Luke, Jesus tells us to, "pray always and not to lose heart." I hope you will join me in praying daily for our beloved church and everyone, especially our youth, in this parish, city, and state. Celebrate this Stewardship Season with me by making a pledge to support the ministry of this special place that we are blessed to call home.
