This past Sunday, we heard a stewardship message from the Rev. Paul Twelves. It was not his first time speaking at Grace, as he was the priest in residence when I became rector



almost 10 years ago! But before this year, I never could have appreciated his talk as personally as I did.

One of the metaphors he used to encourage our giving to Grace was "stretching", using the example of how it's central in the practice of physical therapy. After visiting this year a physical therapist for my first time for a bout of "frozen shoulder," wherein I had never stretched so much in my life, I can tell you personally how effective it is. Stretching, as Paul told us, is key to all sorts of growth - spiritual, emotional, and physical. When we stretch in ways that may not be easy initially, we grow in the various realms of our lives - prayer, communication with others, generosity. They become easier, and, hopefully, more gratifying.

As we approach Ingathering Sunday next week (the 17th), I invite us all to reflect on how we can stretch for the good of ourselves, each other, and our beloved parish, remembering the words of Jesus in Matthew's Gospel: "For where your treasure is there your heart will be also."

1.) in the lot directly across Snow Street from our lot, at the SW corner of Westminster and Snow; and


2.) In the Grace Church parking lot accessed via Snow Street. We ask your kind cooperation in reserving this lot, to the extent possible, for seniors and those with limited mobility.

New Parking Location for Sunday Worship

On Sunday mornings (until noon) we now have use of the parking lot immediately opposite the church lot on Snow Street, next to the Federal Building. Please either park facing the brick of the Federal Building, or on the opposite side facing Snow Street. Once both sides are full, please create a single line of vehicles down the middle, straddling (and parallel to) the line that runs down the middle of the lot. Our hope is that most people will use this new lot, and only use the old lot across Westminster Street if the new one is full. Thank you for reserving spaces in the Grace Church lot for those with mobility considerations.
