

Spotlight on Grace: Mardi Gras!

"Make a joyful noise!" - Psalm 100:1

Christians all over the world celebrate this time just prior to Lent as a period of feasting before the Lenten fast. The English term for the day before Ash Wednesday is Shrove Tuesday, from an Old English term for obtaining forgiveness of sins. It is traditional in England to eat pancakes on Shrove Tuesday, since they contain butter and eggs - foods that might be avoided during the Lenten fast. In fact, the Russian word for the period just before



Lent is "Maslenitsa", from the Russian word for butter, "masla." Most Americans know this festival by its French name, "Mardi Gras" or "Fat Tuesday," and associate it with New Orleans. In years past Grace has hosted a pancake supper, but this year we're celebrating as they might in New Orleans (well, as a *church* might in New Orleans!).

So join us in The Pavilion at Grace for dinner and dancing from 5:00-7:00 PM this Sunday, February 23rd, as we "make a joyful noise." Jambalaya, beans and rice, and drinks will be provided. Please bring one of the following to share: appetizer, corn bread, salad, side dish or dessert. Sarah Barker (wife of Chris Barker, our Director of Administration), a professional dance instructor, will guide us in some line dancing to traditional Mardi Gras music. Kids are most welcome! (Limited parking is available in the church lot as well as on the south side of Chapel Street across from the church, and street parking is always free on Sunday.)



Please find convenient accessible in the Grace Church parking lot with access from Snow Street. The new wheelchair ramp connects




directly from the lot, and you will enter through the new reception entrance of The Pavilion and into the church at ground level.
