

"White Fragility" Reading Group

The Spirit is moving in unusual and important ways during these times. As we bear witness, participate in, and pray for the activism and unrest surrounding police brutality towards the Black community and racial justice in this country, many wonder - what can we do? And more specifically, what is the role of white people during this time?

We are called in our Baptismal Covenant to repent. In repenting we look inward and do the hard work of what the word repent (Greek: metanoia) literally means - change of mind. One very specific way of "changing our minds" or educating ourselves regarding racial injustice is examining the role of whiteness as a state of being and societal construct. It is also an opportunity to deeply consider how white people are conditioned to hold on to whiteness protectively and at the expense of others. It is always a good time to do this work; but now is an especially good time.



To that end, Grace Church parishioners Judith Sutphen and Drake Douglas will offer a facilitated reading of Robin DiAngelo's White Fragility: Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk About Racism over the course of 6 weeks, over Zoom, starting Monday, June 29 at

6pm. Participation will be expected for the full 6 weeks, through August 3. In order to best facilitate healthy discussion group size will be limited. The facilitators are happy to offer an additional reading at a later time, if needed.

An excerpt from the book's forward by preacher, author, and academic Michael Eric Dyon: "DiAngelo bravely challenges the collapse of whiteness into national identity...that the flow of white identity into American identity - of racist beliefs into national beliefs- must be met head-on with a full-throated insistence that what it means to be American is not what it means to be white, at least not exclusively, or even primarily...DiAngelo forces us to see that all politics have rested on identities, and that those identities are critical features of wrestling with how we have gone wrong in the effort to set things right - which too often has meant make them white."
