Spotlight: Vestry Nomination Process

The Grace Church Vestry has twelve members made up of three in-coming classes of four members each, elected to serve three year terms. This creates a stagger in membership, so that no more than one-third of the Vestry cycles off in any given year. However, many vestry members choose to serve a second term so that there is generally less turnover. Members are elected at the Annual Meeting of the parish, held in February.



In 2021, the Vestry will have three openings. Sandra Read and Adrienne Southgate have each completed two terms and must step down under the parish bylaws. Their replacements will be elected to three-year terms. There is also a vacancy for the unexpired term of Douglas Powell, whose employment outside the United States precludes his completing his two final years.

In preparation for the Annual Meeting, the Vestry appointed three of its members (Adrienne and Sandra, and Vestry Clerk Joel Goloskie) and the Rector appointed two members of the parish (Liza Wagner and Charlie Carroll) to serve on the Nominating Committee. Anyone interested in serving on the Vestry can self-nominate by sending an email to Adrienne at <u>asouthgate@providenceri.gov</u> or by calling 301-7823 or the Church office, 331-3225. The nominating process has typically involved conversations between the committee and the nominees about what it's like to be on the Vestry (in terms of time commitment, responsibilities, etc.) and answer any questions the nominees may have. After these conversations, a slate is proposed to the Vestry as a whole and to the Rector. During these times, that process has gone virtual. The committee is meeting on Zoom; interviews are likely to use that platform or telephone/FaceTime. The committee hopes that candidates will prepare a brief biographical statement and indication of how they would like to serve Grace, which can then be included with the Annual Meeting materials.

Interested in serving, but perhaps in some other capacity? The church has several standing committees which welcome participation and which are good places to get your feet wet before joining the Vestry.
