## Spotlight: Know Thy Vestry

*Know Thy Vestry is an ongoing series appearing periodically to help parishioners get to know members of the Vestry of Grace Church. The nomination of Joseph Berryhill to the Vestry was approved last week at the 192nd Annual Meeting of the Parish, alongside Michael D'Alesandre and Nicholas Halar. We look forward to introducing them all, but today's spotlight is on Joseph Berryhill.*

Joseph Berryhill was raised in a Presbyterian family, and became an Episcopalian in his 20s. He is a clinical child psychologist who enjoys hiking, cycling, writing, and being an activist for reducing greenhouse gases and increasing social justice.

After moving to Rhode Island in 2012, Joseph, his wife, Kristie, and their children, Katherine and Julia, were planning to tour most of the Episcopal churches in the greater Providence area. But they visited Grace early on and were immediately attracted to the congregation and its diversity, as well as the sanctuary, music and dynamic priest.



Joseph was a Sunday School teacher from 2012 to 2018, and assisted with fundraising last year for the Choristers trip to Great Britain which had to be canceled due to the pandemic.

In the interest of helping our parishioners gain access to the COVID-19 vaccine as quickly as availability and eligibility will allow, we offer the following information and links.
