## Spotlight: Upcoming Blessing of New Vestments

This coming Sunday is the Fourth Sunday in Lent, which has traditionally been a day on which some of the solemnity and austerity of the Lenten season can be reduced, and a tone of rejoicing in injected into the liturgy. The rejoicing is reflected in the traditional introit, which is based upon a text from Isaiah that begins with the words "Rejoice with Jerusalem," or "Laetare Jerusalem" in Latin. Accordingly, this Sunday is also known as Laetare Sunday or "Refreshment" Sunday.

The 'lightening of mood' on Laetare Sunday permits the use of rose-colored fabrics for vestments, frontals, and hangings, rather than the more somber purple/violet fabrics used generally in Lent. The use of the rose-colored fabrics is one reason Laetare Sunday is also known as a "Rose Sunday."

A similar liturgical practice is observed during



the Third Sunday of Advent, also known as "Gaudete" Sunday. Just as Lent is a more penitential season, Advent is also seen as a time to step back and observe our Christian Faith with more reverence and solemnity. On Gaudete Sunday, rose-colored fabrics are also permitted to be used in place of purple/violet and we light a rose or pink colored candle in the Advent Wreath. Both Lent and Advent are seasons of anticipation, one for the death of Christ, and one for his birth. Laetare Sunday and Gaudete Sunday provide the faithful with a small moment of refreshment during these more solemn seasons and a glimpse of the joys to come.

This Sunday we will bless and use Grace's beautiful, new set of rose-colored vestments, frontals, and hangings, which are the products of the needlework of Sue Hall and the design collaboration of Sue and Vince Edwards; and we will be dedicating these gifts to the members, past and present, of the Altar Guild.


"Thou shalt set the time one hour ahead, no more, no less. One hour ahead shalt the clock be set, and the setting of the clock shalt be one hour ahead . . .

In the interest of helping our parishioners gain access to the COVID-19 vaccine as quickly as availability and eligibility will allow, we offer the following information and links.

Eligibility: In Rhode Island, presently anyone age 65 or older is eligible to receive the vaccine, plus healthcare workers, first responders, and those in
