

Spotlight: Phased Re-Opening of Grace Church

In consultation with the parish Re-opening Committee and the Vestry, I'm sharing with you the good news of the return of in-person worship at Grace Church! This return will take place during the Easter season in three stages:


1) Parishioners 65+ are invited (along with their spouses/partners/care givers) to attend the Easter Day service at 10:00 AM, no registration required. (Covid protocols of social distancing & mask wearing in place.)

2) The Sunday services of April 11 through May 16 will have smaller congregations, and parishioners will sign up in advance to attend those services. Everyone will be able to worship in person at least once, and hopefully twice, during this period. (Again, protocols of social distancing & mask wearing will be in place during this time.) We'll send information on how to sign up for those services in next week's eNews.

3) Full congregational worship on May 23, the Day of Pentecost...with baptisms! Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church, so it's a good day for celebrating.

Of course, we will adjust the plans above as warranted by developments in the pandemic, but this our intention at this time. As we enter Holy Week, I pray this news will bring you joyful hope of the re-birth of congregational worship at our beloved church!



UPDATE

We will have a brief break in the concert series, with no recitals on April 1 or April 8 (due to Holy Week and the week after Easter). The next Thursdays at Noon Concert will be on April 15th. We will welcome the duo "Musicke's Cordes" (Samuel Breen, Baroque violin & Jeffrey Noonan, archlute, theorbo, Baroque guitar) who were scheduled to play last year before the pandemic. The program they will



play is titled "Like the Voice of a Man - The Violin in 17th Century London" and will feature music by Giovanni Zamboni, Arcangelo Corelli, Antonio Vivaldi, Henry Purcell, and Michel Farinell.

This will also be our first concert IN PERSON, since November!

Precautions and procedures will be in place to ensure the safety of all.

Our capacity for the Thursday Concerts will be limited to 30 people.

Information for Making Vaccination Appointments

In the interest of helping our parishioners gain access to the COVID-19 vaccine as quickly as availability and eligibility will allow, we offer the following information and links.

Eligibility: In Rhode Island, presently individuals age 60 or older (or 16 and older for individuals with a [qualifying underlying condition](#)), plus Pre-K through 12 teachers, staff, licensed child care providers, healthcare workers, first responders, and those in congregate settings are eligible to receive the vaccine. Up-to-date [eligibility information can be found here](#).



Additionally, [under a new initiative](#) to increase vaccination rates within certain geographies more heavily impacted by COVID, eligibility for residents of the following zip codes has been expanded to all persons above the age of 16 or 18 (depending upon the minimum age for the respective vaccine), for vaccination at city- and community-run vaccination sites and 'other targeted venues', within those respective communities.
