Spotlight: Know Thy Vestry



Listening Hearts: A Five Week Series

The pandemic has changed us in ways yet to be realized. The Rev. Jennifer West is inviting those so inclined to prayerfully dialogue about our present relationship with God through a five week discussion series based on the renowned book *Listening Hearts* by Suzanne Farnham and others.

Entering its 30th anniversary this book helps readers to “clarify and expand their understanding of call, ministry, discernment, and



community as they relate to one another.” Designed for those with an appreciation for silence and listening, each discussion session will center on an aspect of discernment: What is Call for the Christian?, What is Discernment?, What Conditions Help to Discern God’s Call?, Is It God We Are Hearing?, and Why Is Christian Community Important in Hearing God’s Call?

Beginning on May 22 (Memorial Day Weekend excluded) on Saturday mornings, participants are expected to read *Listening Hearts* before the first session and, to maintain the coherence of the group, to commit to faithful attendance.
