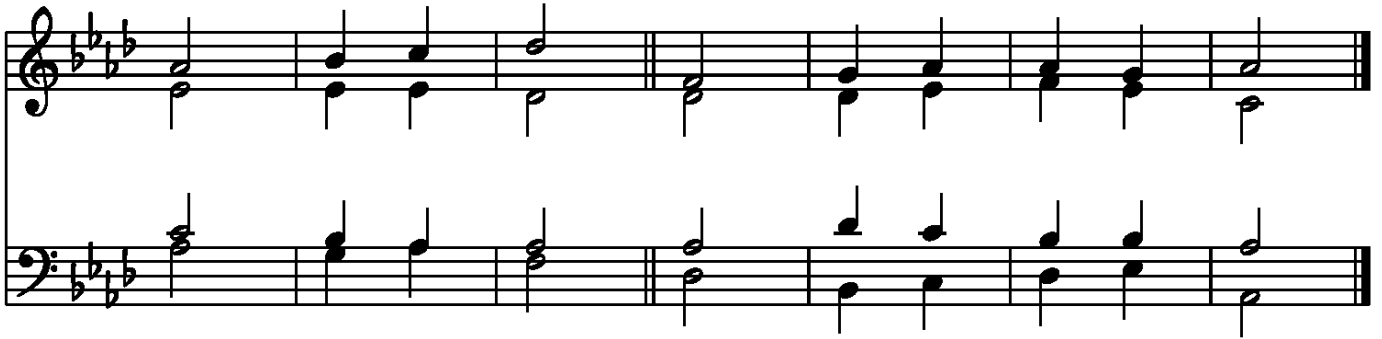
THE OLD TESTAMENT READING

AS WE WORK TOGETHER WITH CHRIST, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says, “At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you.” See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation!
