## Spotlight: Congratulations to our Associate Organist!

Grace Church congratulates our Associate Director of Music, David Heinze, for winning First Prize in the [National Competition in Organ Accompaniment](#) which was held on January 8 at the historic [St. Paul's Church, K Street](#) in Washington, D.C.



The competition, the first-ever of its kind, was co-sponsored by [Schoenstein & Co. Organ Builders](#) of Benicia, California and the [Washington, D.C. Chapter of the American Guild of Organists](#) and was organized by DC AGO Chapter Treasurer Rob Church and the Director of Music at St. Paul's, K Street, Dr. Jeffrey Smith. Most organ competitions focus on solo organ repertoire and not on what most organists do on a weekly basis-- which is to accompany a choir and play hymns.

David and three other finalists were chosen from a pool of applicants (all under the age of 30) who submitted live recordings of hymns, a psalm, and accompanying a soloist on [“The Call” by Ralph Vaughan Williams](#) and a choir on [“How lovely is thy dwelling place” by Johannes Brahms](#).

The live round was challenging, to say the least. The finalists each led the audience in two contrasting hymns (including introduction, interlude, and final verse reharmonisation) of their choice, then accompanied a psalm sung to Anglican chant, a vocal solo, and choral work chosen from a short list. They were each given three hours of practice time on the organ, and then each had a 15-minute rehearsal with a soloist followed by a 30-minute rehearsal with the eight-member professional test choir and the choir director. Forty-five minutes is not a lot of time to rehearse nearly 30 minutes of music with an unfamiliar director, soloist, choir, and organ.

The jury for the live round consisted of Canon [Michael McCarthy](#), Director of Music at the Washington National Cathedral, Professor [Thomas Murray](#), University Organist & Professor of Music Emeritus of Yale University & the Institute of Sacred Music, and [Dr. John Walker](#), Professor of Organ at the Peabody Conservatory. Jack Bethards, President and Tonal Director of Schoenstein & Co. Organ Builders presented the First Place and Second Place prizes of \$5,000 and \$2,500.

As a note of interest, two of the three other competitors have performed at Grace Church on our Thursdays at Noon Concert Series. Jerrick Cavagnaro, who won Second Prize in the competition, played here in November 2019, and Jordan Prescott played in December 2021.

## On-Site Weekday Ministries Paused




## **Sunday Morning Worship: The Second Sunday after The Epiphany January 16, 2022**
