Upcoming Bishop's Visitation

On Sunday, January 30, Grace Church will welcome The Right Reverend W. Nicholas Knisely, Bishop of Rhode Island as Celebrant and Preacher for both 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM Eucharist services. Bishop Knisely's last in-person visitation was on September 29, 2019 for the Feast of Saint Michael & All Angels.
