Spotlight: Choral Music Abounds!

Two of our beloved choral services are returning after a brief (Covid) hiatus! On Sunday, February 20 at 8:00 PM, Compline will be sung by the Women's Compline Choir. Half an hour of chant, candlelight and fragrant



incense combine for a deeply spiritual and calming experience. *Doors open at 7:30 PM*. On Sunday, February 27 at 4:00 PM, the Grace Church Choir and Choristers will sing a service of Choral Evensong, one of the treasures of our Anglican worship traditions. Music of Byrd, Sheppard, Murrill, will be sung, along with Sir John Stainer's monumental double-choir anthem "I saw the Lord." Please join us for one or both of these wonderful choral services. *Please note: As of February 27, masks are optional for fully vaccinated individuals.*

Upcoming Updates to Covid Protocols

As of next Sunday (February 27), mask wearing will be optional at Grace Church. This applies to all activities at Grace (some exceptions may be programs for kids). We still ask those who are not vaccinated to mask (presuming they are over 5 years old), and people are always welcome to mask if they feel more comfortable doing so. Coffee Hour will also return on the 27th, the weekly Wednesday Eucharist



will resume on Ash Wednesday, and the Chalice at Communion will return on Maundy Thursday, a fitting day to do so, as that is when we celebrate the institution of the Lord's Supper! Sunday School will return in Eastertide. If you have any questions about this transition, feel free to call the parish office at 331-3225.

The Committee is also presenting Adrienne Southgate as our delegate to Diocesan Convention, and Melody Ennis as the Alternate Delegate.

Choral Compline this coming Sunday

This coming Sunday, February 20th at 8:00 PM the women of the Grace Church Schola will sing a short, 30-minute service of Choral Compline. Come, pray in the stillness, and experience the unaccompanied singing of Gregorian chant and Renaissance polyphony in a darkened church, lighted
