





THE HOLY GOSPEL Luke 15:1-3, 11b-32

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Luke.

And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them." So Jesus told them this parable: "There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me.' So he divided his property between them. A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and traveled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called

your son; treat me like one of your hired hands." So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe – the best one – and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate. "Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. He replied, Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound.' Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.""

ABOUT LÆTÁRE (ROSE) SUNDAY: The Fourth Sunday in Lent, has traditionally been a day on which some of the solemnity and austerity of the Lenten season is reduced, and a tone of rejoicing in injected into the liturgy. The rejoicing is reflected in the traditional introit, which is based upon a text from Isaiah that begins with the words "Rejoice with Jerusalem," or "Laetare Jerusalem" in Latin. Accordingly, this Sunday is also known as Laetare Sunday or "Refreshment" Sunday. The 'lightening of mood' on Laetare Sunday permits the use of rosecolored fabrics for vestments, frontals, and hangings, rather than the more somber purple/violet fabrics generally used in Lent. The use of the rose-colored fabrics is one reason Laetare Sunday is also known as a "Rose" Sunday. Laetare Sunday provides the faithful with a small moment of refreshment during this more solemn season and a glimpse of the joys to come in Eastertide. This Sunday we will use Grace's beautiful set of rose-colored vestments, frontals, and hangings, which were created by talented parishioner and Altar Guild member Sue Hall. We are grateful to Sue for sharing her needlework and design skills with us. This special rose set is dedicated to the Altar Guild and a inscription that reads "In honor of the Grace" Church Altar Guild members, past and present. Laetare Sunday, March 14, 2021" is stitched on the reverse side of the High Altar superfrontal.
