Upcoming 'Grace Church Day' on Ascension Sunday

From the centennial History of Grace Church [1929]: "Ascension Day, May 1 [1913], saw the active operation of a plan dear to [the Rector's] heart, namely the observance of that festival as 'Grace Church Day,' comparable to Trinity Sunday or the appropriate Saints' Day for a Church bearing the name of the Trinity or of some saint." More than a century later, it's still a good idea! Ascension Sunday will therefore be celebrated on May 29th this year as "Grace Church Day" with a pot-luck



lunch after the 10:00 AM Eucharist. The lunch is being coordinated by our Junior Warden, Diane Stamp. Upcoming Choral Concert: The Marywood University Chamber Singers

On **Thursday, May 19 at 7:00 PM.** The Marywood University Chamber Singers, directed



by Rick Hoffenberg, will sing a concert of works by Giovanni Perluigi da Palestrina, Samuel Barber, and Wolfram Buchenberg, along with several folk songs and spirituals.

The Marywood University Chamber Singers are a select ensemble of undergraduates pursuing a variety of majors. They have performed on music series throughout the Northeastern United States and are featured on an annual PBS broadcast. They embark on a concert tour each May to various parts of the United States and Canada. Recent venues have included Steinway Hall and St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, St. Francis of Assisi Cathedral in New Jersey, First Church and Faneuil Hall in Boston, Yale University's Marquand Chapel, Notre Dame Basilica in Montreal, and several locales in California, Florida, Georgia, and Louisiana. The Marywood University Chamber Singers were finalists in the Collegiate Choral Division of The American Prize. After being the featured choir for the 2021 National Meeting of the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities, the ensemble was invited to be the featured choir again for the 2022 ACCU National Meeting in Washington, DC.
