Nametags Available



Ongoing Wall of Hope Restoration

Grace Episcopal Church has been partnering with RI's 9/11 Memorial, the "Wall of Hope," to gather volunteers to help prepare this community art display for its reinstallation this fall. The project is open to anyone willing to help out! Scouts, community & faith



groups, and individuals are encouraged to join Grace parishioners in this group effort! Please forward this info to anyone who might be interested - the more the merrier!

We are volunteering to help with final touches in the restoration of this beautiful display of colorful, painted tiles before its reinstallation in our downtown neighborhood later this fall. The tiles are communal art representing messages of remembrance, peace, and hope. They were painted by 12,000 residents of RI, including everyone from schoolchildren to inmates, to show their vision of a better world after the 2001 tragedy. You may remember the tiles from their previous installation in a tunnel near Waterplace Park. Check out more details about the project here!

Details:

- People are needed to help move heavy panels of tiles, sand rusty steel frames, and wash and paint steel frames. You can choose which jobs work best for you! (Ie, if you prefer to avoid any lifting, you can be a washer & painter.)
- Most of the work will be outside or near a large open loading door just inside the warehouse.

- Middle-school-age kids and older are invited! Not appropriate for younger children due to safety concerns.
- Street parking is available near the warehouse.
- Expect to get dirty & bring a water bottle!
- Supplies are provided, but if you happen to have work gloves, latex gloves, N95 mask for sanding, bucket & sponge, please bring them along!

Please note: The project is **NOT happening on Sat, Sept 24** as some of you have previously heard. That work date has been rescheduled for Sat, Oct 1 as listed here.


Kids' Table at Coffee Hour
