
Reader A reading from Paul's Letter to the Philippians

THE COMMUNION

To receive communion, extend your hands to the Priest, who will place the wafer in your hand (if you would like a gluten-free wafer, please ask for one). If you wish to receive the wine in an individual cup, approach the Communion Station in the Baptistry to the left of the Eagle Lectern, take a small, compostable cup from the table next to the pillar, and the Minister of Communion will pour a small amount of wine into it. After drinking the wine, place the cup in the basket by the pillar and return to your seat via the Side Aisle.

If you would prefer to receive a blessing, cross your arms over your chest when you come to the Altar.



IHS AND THE HOLY NAME OF JESUS: The monogram (initials) IHS refers to Jesus and is made up of the first three letters of the name of Jesus when written in the Greek alphabet. The three letters were incorrectly transcribed/written in the Latin/English alphabet as I H S. The monogram became very popular in the Middle Ages and many explanations of IHS were offered, the most common being Iesus Hominum Salvator (latin for "Jesus, Saviour of Mankind"). Likewise, today IHS is sometimes understood to represent the phrase "In His Service". The monogram is frequently seen in liturgical art and architecture, especially vestments. Devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus was popularized by the Franciscans in the fifteenth century. Bernardino of Siena (1380-1444) displayed the monogram on a tablet at the end of his sermons to encourage devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus. – Anglican Church of Canada website, FAQs and An Episcopal Dictionary of the Church (episcopalchurch.org/glossary/ihs)


