## The Blessing of New Green Vestments

Following the First Sunday after the Epiphany, also known as The Baptism of Christ, the church's altar hangings, and vestments return to the color green before changing to purple for the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday. This year, Grace Church



parishioner and master seamstress Sue Hall has created a new set of green-coloured altar hangings and vestments for use at Grace during Epiphanytide. This new set will be unveiled and blessed at the 10:00 AM Sung Holy Eucharist this coming Sunday, January 15th. After the service, all are most welcome to come up to the Chancel and High Altar to have a closer look at Sue's magnificent handiwork!

#### Choral Compline this Sunday

This coming Sunday, January 15 at 8:00 PM the women of the Grace Church Schola will sing a short, 30-minute service of Choral Compline. Come, pray in the stillness, and experience the unaccompanied singing of Gregorian Chant and Renaissance Polyphony in a darkened church, lighted only by candles and with fragrant incense wafting through the air.
