



THE EPISTLE READING Romans 4:13-25

Reader A reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans

◀HE PROMISE THAT HE WOULD INHERIT the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation. For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations") – in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So numerous shall your descendants be." He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. Therefore his faith "was reckoned to him as righteousness." Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

When Jesus came to the leader's house and saw the flute players and the crowd making a commotion, he said, "Go away; for the girl is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. Senior Warden Emerita and licensed attorney, Adrienne Southgate, is an authorized Notary Public AND has access to commercial shredding. She's offering to notarize any documents for you or to collect any papers (cancelled checks, old tax records, medical bills with your Social Security number or other identifying information, etc.) which you would like to have shredded. (Records will be taken directly to the shredding machine at 9:00 AM Monday morning.) If you'd like to take her up on her offer, she'll be stationed in the alcove (by the paintings) in The Pavilion during Coffee Hour this morning.

GRACE CHURCH'S REFUGEE MINISTRY is growing....and you're invited to be a part! Building on our successful apartment-preparation ministry this past year, and In conversation with Dorcas International's refugee resettlement program, our ministry with refugees is expanding in three important ways. First, our apartment-preparation will become bi-monthly and will grow to include the entire preparation-for-arrival for refugees, including taking responsibility for furnishings, food, and whatever else might prepare a warm welcome for new arrivals. Second, through our "Restart Kits for Refugees" you are invited to fill a tub with specific items new arrivals will need to help them set up their new homes. Third, in teams of two we are invited to become mentors for newly arrived families. Under the guidance of a Dorcas Case Manager, mentors are matched with a specific family to be a welcoming friend, someone who can help new arrivals navigate, discover resources, practice English, or whatever is needed. The time commitment is at least two hours a week for at least 3 months.
