
Stewardship 2024 Testimonial: Kenneth Reeves



Over the course of the coming weeks, we're hearing from four parishioners about what inspires them to give to Grace and make Grace their church home.






Collegium Concert this Sunday

TO COMMEMORATE ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED


THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 2ND, 2023 6:00 PM

Photos for All Souls' and/or All Saints': It is a tradition at Grace Church that photos of departed loved ones are placed on the High Altar for the feast days of All Souls' (November 2) and All Saints' (November 5). All are welcome to bring a framed photo of a loved one to place on the High Altar for either or both services.

Thanksgiving Food Drive

The Outreach Ministry at Grace Church invites all parishioners to kindly consider bringing non-perishable food items to the church in the lead-up to Thanksgiving, and indeed throughout the holiday season. Our donated food will be distributed to families in need through St. Peter's and St. Andrew's Episcopal Church. All healthy non-perishables are welcome, though particularly sought-after items include: canned vegetables and fruit, stuffing mix, turkey gravy, rice, coffee, oatmeal, healthy breakfast cereals, and especially peanut butter.

A receptacle will be placed in the back of the church. If you have a spare cardboard box to carry them in, that is helpful, but not crucial. Let us strive to gather ample supplies for this year's drive, as the need is truly great.
